Welcome to the 2022 school year! We hope everyone had a fantastic holiday and are excited to be back at kura again. We are ecstatic to welcome 14 new students and whānau to our kura and hope you are all settling in well with us. To our whānau who have joined us this year, thank you for putting your trust in us to provide the educational pathway for your tamaiti. We look forward to working closely with you to achieve our educational goals together in 2022.

We have lots of new changes this term such as staffing, teacher only days, and reminders that we need to update you about. So bear with us as we endeavor to enlighten you about what's happening in our kura this term.

UNIFORMS

If your child has outgrown their school uniform polo's, our kura will provide 2 new school shirts per year to every enrolled student. Additional shirts can be purchased from the office at \$25 each. School jackets have unfortunately increased in price. Junior sizes from 4 - 14 are now \$90, and senior size jackets from Adult S to 5XL are now \$109. These are the direct costs from the printer, we do not add any surcharges for our kura. These need to be ordered through the office with a deposit before orders are placed. If you require financial assistance, please talk to our office as we may be able to assist you. Time payments to the school bank account is fine. Please ask for a deposit slip from the office to set up regular payments. The jackets take approximately 2 weeks to arrive. For all uniform enguries, please contact our office on 4097813.

LICE TREATMENT AVAILABLE

Headlice is common when children are swimming in the pool these summer days. We have plenty of lice treatment and nit combs available for whānau. Please feel free to ask or collect yourself from the office. If we notice any students with signs of lice, we will discreetly send some treatment home with your child.

SWIMMING POOL

Our school swimming pool is open for instructional swimming. Each class has their own swimming timetable and tamariki are encouraged to bring their swimming gear on their classes swimming days. If your tamaiti is unable to swim, please send a note to their teacher. Swimming is an important life skill for us living in a coastal area, so we encourage tamariki to learn these basic skills from an early age.

ABSENCES

If your tamaiti will be absent from kura, please notify our office as soon as possible. Notifying our office is a safety measure to ensure we know where your tamaiti is.

KA ORA KA AKO

School lunches are now being provided daily and made fresh onsite by Alex. Lunch is served at morning tea break at 10:30am. Second lunch break is at 12:40pm and whāmau may still wish to bring their own snacks which is fine. We do wish to remind parents of healthier snack options. Please do not send sugar flavoured drinks, or high sugar snacks. Our kura promotes water only and nutritious kai for healthier learning. If your child has any food allergies, please inform our office.

The beginning of the year is the best time to update contact details. It is imperative that we have up to date contact details for parents/caregivers in case of emergencies. If you have recently moved addresses, or changed phone numbers, please contact the office to update these


